





"Many might wonder what it would take to match their digital and IRL selves. And if it's possible that a cosmetic procedure might give them the same result a Facetune tap would, they could be open to it."

Kayleen Schaefer is a New York-based writer and editor. In the following viewpoint, Schaefer argues that many young women are deciding to undergo potentially hazardous cosmetic procedures to address the disconnect between their digital and "in real life" (IRL) selves. Schaefer cites statistics and testimonies from medical professionals who have worked with teenage girls who are requesting unnecessary medical procedures to change how they look. Schaefer connects this behavior to the "selfie culture" created by social media. According to Schaefer, this culture encourages many young women to go after unrealistic standards of beauty, which then compels them to edit their photographs and ultimately their own bodies. For Schaefer, this culture fosters a never-ending obsession to achieve perfection, one that eclipses young girls' confidence in their real selves.

A negative [body image](#) may increase alcohol and [tobacco](#) use among teens, a new study finds. Published online in February in the Journal of Child and Adolescent [Substance Abuse](#), the study is based on data from the [Health Behavior in School-Aged Children](#) 2001-2002 survey. Researchers found that [girls](#) who perceived themselves as a "bit too fat" and "much too fat" were significantly more likely to have tried [smoking](#), compared with girls who perceived themselves as "about the right size." Among boys, those who saw themselves as a "bit too thin" or "much too thin" were more likely to try smoking than boys who saw their body as about the right size. Boys who perceived their bodies as "much too fat" were less likely to try smoking than their "rightsize" counterparts.

On alcohol, girls who saw themselves as a "bit too fat" or "much too fat" were significantly more likely to currently drink. For boys, those who reported being a "bit too fat" were significantly less

In 2014, more than 160,000 teens ages 13 to 19 had cosmetic minimally invasive procedures such as laser skin resurfacing, and more than 100,000 had breast augmentation, according to the American Society of Plastic Surgeons. Instagram, the social media platform where users post photos of themselves, has become a hub for this trend. "It's a desire to actually change their appearance as well as a desire to actually change their appearance," says Gloria Cavallaro, a creative consultant in her 20s, who regularly posts selfies in a creative series intended to showcase her makeup looks. "Her lips look more symmetrical and pillowy; she overdraws them with lip pencil, putting on more color than she needs."
