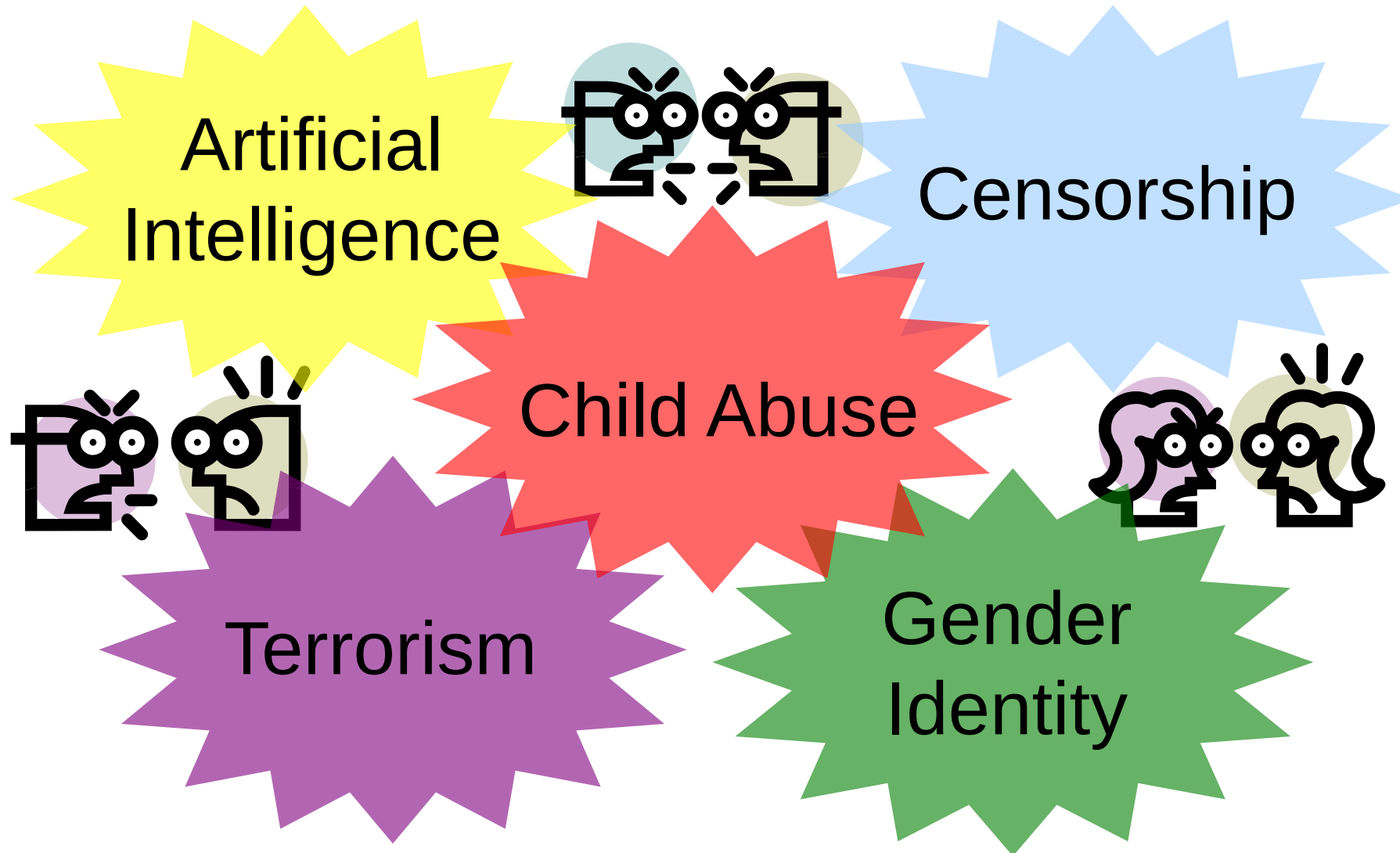

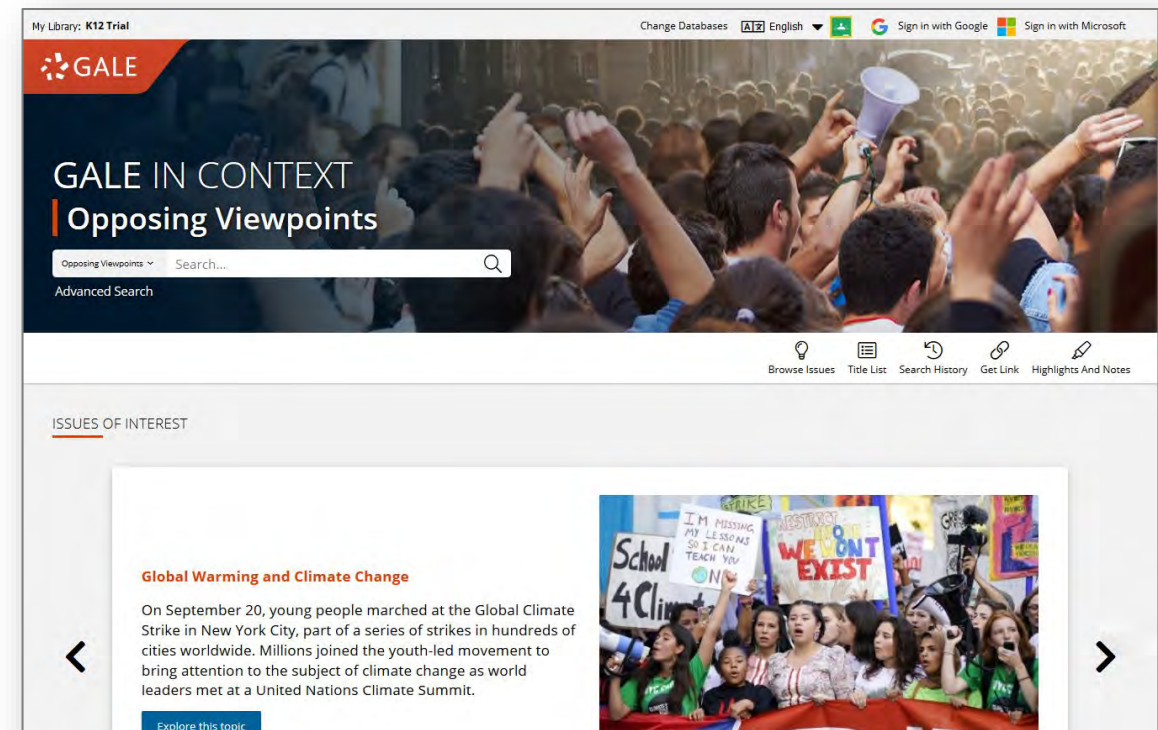

Body image refers to the way a person perceives their own physical appearance and how that perception affects their sense of self-worth. Thus, body image not only addresses how one looks, but also how one feels and acts in response to his or her perceived appearance. A person's body image can change over time, affected by popularized beauty standards, family environment, peer influence, images in the media, personal experiences, and medical conditions. In the twenty-first century, psychologists have expressed concern regarding the effects of widespread social media adoption on users' body image.

Many people develop body image issues during their teenage years, when bodies increase their stores of muscle and fat and undergo growth spurts. During this time, teenagers often...

Schaefer connects this behavior to the "selfie culture" created by **social media**. According to Schaefer, this culture encourages many **young women** to go after unrealistic standards of **beauty**, which then compels them to edit their **photographs** and ultimately their own bodies. For Schaefer, this culture fosters a never-ending obsession to achieve perfection, one that eclipses young **girls'** confidence in their real selves.

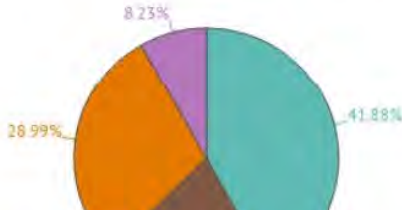

A negative [body image](#) may increase alcohol and [tobacco](#) use among teens, a new study finds.

Published online in February in the Journal of Child and Adolescent [Substance Abuse](#), the study is based on data from the [Health Behavior in School-Aged Children](#) 2001-2002 survey. Researchers found that [girls](#) who perceived themselves as a "bit too fat" and "much too fat" were significantly more likely to have tried [smoking](#), compared with girls who perceived themselves as "about the right size." Among boys, those who saw themselves as a "bit too thin" or "much too thin" were more likely to try smoking than boys who saw their body as about the right size. Boys who perceived their bodies as "much too fat" were less likely to try smoking than their "rightsize" counterparts.

On alcohol, girls who saw themselves as a "bit too fat" or "much too fat" were significantly more likely to currently drink. For boys, those who reported being a "bit too fat" were significantly less
