Prof. Wong Yoon-wah (王潤華) is a poet, prose writer and also a prolific scholar in the field of modern Chinese literature and diasporic Chinese literature. He was born on August 13, 1941 in Temoh, Perak, Malaysia and is married to Dan Ying 淡瑩 (maiden name, Poo Chan Pauline Lew). He obtained his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Madison, Wisconsin, USA in 1969 and 1972 respectively. He started his teaching career in Nanyang University in 1973 until 1979. Then he joined the National University of Singapore between 1979 and 2002, and later the Yuan Ze University, Taiwan between 2002 and 2011. He resides in Malaysia on retirement.

Prof. Wong taught and researched mainly in Chinese literature including comparative literature, Dreams of the Red Chambers, Tang poetry and poetics, world Chinese literature and culture, Chinese studies in the West as well as Chinese literature and film, etc. He has also authored many books and journal articles. His scholarship and works have generated impacts on Chinese literature in Singapore, Malaysia, Taiwan and mainland China.

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Scope and Contents

The Papers mainly consist of materials written by or related to Prof. Tse-tung Chow (###). These materials, collected by Prof. Wong Yoon-wah, include Prof. Chow's poems for book publication, his correspondence, calligraphies, essays and photographs as well as some assignments and notes of which the majority was written by Prof. Wong.

Prof. Wong and his wife, Dan Ying were Prof. Chow's students at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, USA. They had established a very close relationship and the two families have kept in close contact ever since.

In the Papers, there are photographs of Prof. Wong, Prof. Chow and their families and friends. Some of these photographs were taken in the gatherings at Prof. Chow's home.

Prof. Chow was a poet, calligrapher and renowned scholar in Dreams of the Red Chambers, Chinese language and literature. Prof. Wong and Dan Ying are poets too. Prof. Chow often shared his Chinese calligraphy, articles and essays with his correspondents. Chinese literature, especially Chinese poems was a frequent discussion topic in Prof. Chow's correspondence.

Prof. Chow's dedication to Chinese literature has significant influences on Prof. Wong's research and career development. In fact, Prof. Wong has written and edited some journal articles and books on Prof. Chow's scholarly works and poems. Therefore, a big portion of the Papers includes photocopies of Prof. Chow's poems and correspondence discussing the publication projects of his poems.

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Arrangement

Arranged in 6 series: 1. Book manuscripts, 2. Calligraphy, 3. Correspondence, 4. Essays and articles, 5. Lecture notes and assignments, and 6. Photographs.

The records' original arrangement was by and large retained. The folders are now arranged alphabetically by subject and document type (i.e. correspondence, manuscripts, etc.) and then chronologically within each type of document classification.

Book manuscripts files mainly consist of photocopies of Prof. Tse-tsung Chow's poems selected for publishing and correspondence discussing the selection process. Correspondents include Prof. Chow, Prof. Wong Yoon-wah and his wife Pauline Lew (Dan Ying), Chinglin Wang and the publishers, etc. The book entitled 《創作與回憶》 was published on Prof. Chow's 75th birthday and some correspondence are about the publication of Prof. Chow's translated poems in 《風媒集》 in 2017. Many poems selected for the book entitled 《胡說草》 were originally published in an earlier work entitled 《海燕》.
